AUGUST 12 is International Youth Day (IYD), and in recognition of United Nations-designated this event Villajoyosa town hall has arranged live music performances by local groups and kayak outings.

From 19.00-24.00 tomorrow (Saturday), local musical acts Sinestesia, Jaelo, Rosted and Miguel Sánchez will be performing live in the parking area of Paraiso beach.

The featured artists all rehearse at the Punt de Trobada Jove municipal youth centre.

Prior to this, at 09.00 and 16.00, the town hall is collaborating with Alicante Aventura to organise two kayak outings entitled 'the bays of Villajoyosa', which will leave from Playa Paradís. The activity is aimed at young people aged from 12-30, and costs €20 per person. The price of this activity has been partially subsidised.

Registration for the kayak outings is taking place at the Casa de la Juventud, which is situated at Calle Fray Posidonio 30.

A 'mayor for change'

THE CENTRAL library in Benidorm is hosting an exhibition about Pedro Zaragoza Orts - 'the mayor of change'

The exhibition brings together various panels related to the personal and political life of the Benidorm-born politician.

'Pedro Zaragoza Orts: el alcalde del cambio (1950-1967)' also contains related images, texts and works from the library's archive, and is divided into eight sections.

The sections cover aspects such as Sr Zaragoza's political biography, his tra-jectory at the town hall, his role as a civil governor in Guadalajara and his life after retiring from politics.

Another section contains images and texts relating to the water problems experienced in the municipality, the time when a water well was acquired in Polop to supply the town, and the pipe-

line project.

It also looks at the development of the 'vertical city', starting with the 1956 Town Plan (PGOU) and the changes until 1963, the song festival, allowing women to wear bikinis in the town, and much more.

The exhibition is open Monday to Friday from 09.00-20.00 until further notice.

Craft fair in Hondón

THE ANNUAL arts and crafts fair returns to Hondón de las Nieves on Friday and Saturday, August 11-12, with many demonstrations and workshops.

The biggest novelty of this year's eighth edition is that the organiser, craft association Amata, is celebrating its 25th anniversary with a contest of unique pieces, made by the participants. During the fair, the pieces in the contest will be on display at the stalls of the corresponding makers, and visitors are invited to vote for the piece they like best.

Like other years, everything that is sold at this fair is made by the craftsman or craftswoman who attends you. More than 20 artisans are expected, and each stall offers something different and original: pieces of silver, glass, wood, leather, ceramics and fabric, all carefully worked to satisfy the taste of the most demanding visitor.

In addition, there will be artificial stone carving demonstrations and socarrat (fired clay tiles covered with a white base, normally painted in red and black, which are traditional in the Manises and Paterna area of Valencia) painting. The potter will also bring his wheel to offer visitors the chance to make their own bowl or cup.

There will be workshops for children, board games and a merry-goround.

On both days a magician will walk through the fair entertaining the public with his tricks and pranks.

On the Friday evening, a juggler closes the fair with a fire show and the magician will put on a great magic show on Saturday night, just before
